The Centre for Heritage Studies is a pioneer institution under the Department of Cultural Affairs, Govt. of Kerala, situated at the premises of Archaeological Museum, Hill Palace, Tripunithura. The Centre was established in 2000 with the following aims:

- To provide for various courses of study, training and research in different branches of Archaeology, Museology, Archival Studies and Conservation of Cultural property, etc.
- To provide and offer facilities for fundamental research in Art, Museology, Archaeology, Archival Studies and Conservation of Cultural properties and the like.
- To establish norms for the advancement and dissemination of knowledge on the scientific aspects of research on the cultural heritage of human kind.

The Centre undertakes various educational and research programmes and brings out publications in the field of heritage studies. The Centre also conducts post graduate diploma courses in Archaeology, Museology, Archival Studies and Conservation. The Centre also offers integrated training for teachers and demonstrators engaged in educational activities. The Centre has a conservation laboratory to offer training to the students. The P.G. Diploma courses are being conducted after getting sanction from Government. At present there is no recognition from any university.

Course information

The details of the courses offered by the Centre are as follows :

P.G. Diploma in Archaeology

There is a scope for trained Archaeologists to fulfill the needs of the country. Generally, Archaeology deals with the material remains of the past. This diploma course describes the fundamental aspects of Archaeology and also offers training in exploration and excavation methods.

The course has six theory papers and includes an internal assessment based on study tours/ seminars/ project reports.

I. P.G Diploma in Museology

Museology is gaining popularity as a discipline that helps to preserve the rich cultural heritage of our country for posterity. There is a need for establishing more museums in districts, tourist destinations and municipalities, for exhibiting the cultural wealth of our country. Museology deals with modern concept and it enables them to acquire the necessary skills for efficient management of museum. Modern trends in Museology at the international level have been included in the course.

The course has six theory papers and includes an internal assessment based on study tours/ seminars/ project reports.

II. P.G Diploma in Archival Studies

Archives play a vital role in preserving the documents of historical significance. Archival studies deals with the keeping of noncurrent records. In India, especially in Kerala, there is acute shortage of trained professionals for proper management of records. With the growing awareness there is more demand for trained professionals for archival maintenance. The course intends to train the students in archives keeping, records management and conservation of documents.

The course has six theory papers and also includes an internal assessment based on study tours/seminars/project reports.

V P.G Diploma in Conservation

Conservation of cultural heritage is the most important aspect in heritage management. Preservation of monuments and antiquities for posterity depends upon the availability of conservators. This diploma course has been structured to meet this need. The Hill Palace museum gives ample training opportunities for the students in conservation.

The course has six theory papers and includes an internal assessment based on study tours/seminars/ project reports.

Eligibility for Admission

Admission to the course is based on the marks obtained in graduate/ P.G Examination and interview to be conducted by the Centre. A relaxation of 5 % is admissible for candidates belonging to SC/ST categories, i. e. a

Duration

All the P.G. Diploma programmes consist of 2 semesters having six months each.

Seats

All the P. G. Diploma courses have 15 seats each. Candidates sponsored by Govt. Departments may be admitted to each programme subject to a maximum of 2 in addition to the above mentioned number of seats.

If there is no sufficient number of candidates in a particular course, it will be cancelled.

Candidates belonging to SC/S T/OEC communities are exempted from payment of tuition fee. They should provide Community Certificate from the Village Officer in order to avail the benefit.

For study tours, field trips, if any, the students will have to bear their own expenses.

Hostel

The Centre has no hostel facilities. Students will have to arrange for boarding and lodging, for their own.

Method of Examination

Each course has six theory papers; three papers in each semester. Semester exam will be held at the end of each semester and results will be published in due course. Internal assessment based on study tours/ seminars/ projects/ assignment are also compulsory.
